She is preceded in death by her father, Willie Edmonds, her mother Helen Edmonds, and her sisters Estelle Rossi, Kathleen Rousch, Christine Brady. Elaine is survived by her husband Jim Cook, her daughter Sheryll Grotto and her husband Sean, and her grandchildren Elijah, Jonah, Leah, and Noah. She is also survived by her brothers Sterling, Herbert, Maxie, David, Dennis, Roger, and Charles Edmonds, and her sister Marie Morris.

Elaine was one of twelve children, seven boys and five girls. The oldest four were half-siblings and Elaine was the oldest of the eight children from her father's second marriage. She spent her early childhood in Virginia. After that she grew up in Brigham City, Utah. She met Jim during her childhood when his family moved to Brigham City.

Elaine's mother converted from LDS to Christianity and began to attend the Bible Church of Brigham City with the children. Her mother's faith had a large influence on Elaine's own and as a young teen Elaine trusted Jesus Christ as her own personal Savior at a Christian youth camp.

Elaine married Jim Cook in 1964. They lived in Chicago where Elaine worked at the Moody Bible Institute while Jim attended Moody. They then moved to southern Illinois where they opened the Author's Office in 1967. Elaine's incredible typing speed was an asset to their company as they typed up term papers, theses, dissertations, and manuscripts in the days before home computers and printers.

In 1974, Elaine became pregnant and though advised against it by some doctors she carried the pregnancy to term and gave birth to a daughter whom they named Sheryll Elaine. Elaine worked at Southern Illinois University where she was secretary at the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library and edited the first volume of his published papers.

In 1980, the family moved to Salt Lake City, Utah. Elaine worked at Valley Bank & Leasing for several years before opting to stay home full time. In 1990, she suffered a stroke which qualified her for rehabilitative services that paid for her to earn an Associate's Degree in Accounting, graduating from SLCC in 1994. With her new degree she worked at Central Office Supply for several years before moving to the Utah Department of Corrections at the Utah State Prison where she worked for 10 years before retiring in 2010.

Elaine's medical history was unique. Rheumatic fever in her childhood damaged her heart and made surgery necessary when she was just 26 years old. Valve replacement at that time was risky but Elaine was blessed to have Dr. Michael DeBakey as her surgeon. Later in life she would have two more heart surgeries to repair and replace her other heart valves and then a pacemaker to help with arrhythmia. Her medical history also included Type II diabetes, a double mastectomy, gall bladder removal, pancreatitis, two strokes, and too many blood tests and procedures to count. Though in the end it was her heart that failed, Elaine lived longer than expected.

Elaine was a talented cross-stitcher, and made many pieces that she gave as gifts. She also enjoyed knitting and crocheting and made numerous afghans over the years. She was an avid reader and also loved her cats. Elaine was a member of Midvalley Bible Church for over 30 years where she volunteered in Awana and enjoyed helping in the church nursery. She loved her grandchildren and made several trips to Australia to visit them. She and Jim enjoyed 51 years of marriage together.

As per her wishes her body has been donated to the University of Utah for medical research. She will be missed.


